





## Federal, State, and County Regulations

### [#2020-112 Executive Order re: Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery](#)

Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step Plan for Florida's Recovery, is effective May 4, 2020 with no set expiration date, and the following apply:

- Senior citizens and individuals with underlying serious medical conditions are strongly encouraged to stay home and limit exposure to reduce COVID-19 risks.

- All essential services and activities previously allowed under the State's Safer at Home Order may continue in the same manner in which they have been operating, including adherence to the safety guidelines issued by the CDC and OSHA.
- Consistent with the Governor's prior orders, Bars, Pubs and Nightclubs remain closed.
- Vacation rentals also remain prohibited.
- Restaurants and Food Establishments may reopen dining areas with a maximum occupancy of 25% of the stated building capacity. Bar counters where alcohol is served must remain closed. Outdoor seating is permitted under the Governor's order without building capacity limitations, as long as appropriate CDC social distancing guidelines are followed. Please note that local ordinances may limit outside seating. Additional guidance for restaurants and food establishments is enclosed in the last page of this document
- Beginning on May 4, 2020, unless specifically prohibited and set forth below, non-essential services and activities may operate using social distancing guidelines. All non-essential services and activities may engage in unlimited curbside delivery and pickup. All permissible in-store activities must adhere to a maximum of 25% of the stated building occupancy. Employees, staff and/or independent contractors working at the establishment do not count toward the 25% building occupancy. Patrons will still be required to follow the appropriate CDC social distancing (no groups larger than 10 and maintain 6 feet between groups). The 25% maximum occupancy limit does not apply to essential services or activities, such as grocery stores, medical offices and home improvement stores, etc.
- The following non-essential services and activity types must remain **CLOSED** per the Governor: Arcade and video/game rooms, Day/Beauty spa service, Hair salon services, (including braiding, hair cutting and styling), Nail salon services, Barber shop services, Fitness, dance, Pilates, and yoga studios and gyms, Massage (unless directed by a medical provider),Painting, craft, or art studios ,Tattoo and piercing services ,Bowling, Zoos, Pool halls ,Concert and music halls, Locations with amusement rides and/or water parks,Movie and other theaters (including adult entertainment theaters)
- The Governor's executive order directs everyone not to congregate in groups of more than 10 people and that people not of the same group remain 6 feet apart. This must be adhered to in a practical way while using common sense. To clarify, the directives do not prohibit 10 people from being in one building or place. More than 10 people are allowed in grocery stores, churches, parks, etc.; however, they must be 6 feet apart from those not in the same group. If you arrive together, you are allowed to stay together. Large gatherings for sporting, leisure or similar activities at venues, arenas and stadiums are prohibited.

## County Orders and Guidance

1. Under the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners' Resolution #20-33 effective April 30, 2020 all pools may reopen and are limited to 50% of that pool's posted capacity and everyone is directed not to congregate in groups of more than ten people and that people not of the same group must remain six feet apart. Owners and operators must follow the CDC guidelines for cleaning and disinfection of facilities.
2. Under the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners' Resolution #20-35 effective April 30, 2020 playgrounds and play equipment located at private child care facilities may reopen while following the Governor's Executive Order of no more than nine children and one caregiver per classroom, provided that all equipment used by one group of children must be cleaned and sanitized before use by another group of children. Owners and operators must follow the CDC guidelines for cleaning and disinfection of facilities. Public playgrounds remain closed.
3. Under the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners' Resolution #20-34 effective May 4, 2020 all Pinellas County public beaches and public beach parking facilities may reopen on May 4 and everyone is directed not to congregate in groups of more than ten people and that people not of the same group must remain six feet apart. Public beach

restrooms may be open with enhanced cleaning and sanitation that meet CDC guidelines for cleaning and disinfection.

4. All residents are strongly encouraged to wear face masks per CDC guidance when in places of high foot traffic such as grocery and retail stores.
5. In the word of the Sheriff "if a business is not on the NO list, then feel free to open with the same 25% guidance."

## Town Facilities, Programs, and Services

- **Town Buildings:** All buildings remain closed to public access other than a drop-off location for permits that are available in Town Hall (at the Police Department entrance). Staff will meet in person by appointment only until May 11th. After May 11th the Town hall will be open Tuesdays and Thursdays. All employees and visitors will be screened prior to entry. Masks are required only for interactions where social distancing is unavoidable. All employees will be provided masks and PPE appropriate for their roles.
- **Parks:** Following Pinellas County's guidance, all Belleair parks are open. However, facilities like playgrounds and restrooms remain closed pursuant to the Governor's order.. Users are expected to abide by CDC guidelines on social distancing while using parks and greenspaces. The tennis courts have been reopened to tennis members and must participate in accordance with social distancing guidelines provided at the courts.
- **Recycling:** Recycling will resume May 7th.
- **Infrastructure Projects:** Work on all town projects has resumed after a brief period of social distancing..
- **Recreational Events and Programs:** All of Belleair's recreational special events, programs, leagues, rentals, and activities have been canceled or postponed through the end of May. Staff is drafting a plan to begin child care in accordance with CDC guidelines. Capacity is estimated to be 30 to 40 children and spots will be prioritized by a parent or guardian employed as first responder, healthcare worker, critical infrastructure employee, AND be a resident. Staff is also working on a phase 2 plan which may include summer camps in accordance with CDC guidelines and executive orders.
- **Grad Parade:** The BCF and the Rec Department are hosting a socially distant graduation parade that will honor and congratulate graduating seniors and eighth grade students on May 30th at 5 pm. This parade will have a long route through multiple parks so that families and friends can celebrate socially distant on sidewalks and park spaces. The parade will give our graduates an opportunity to showcase their accomplishments and allow residents and the community to cheer them on all while at a safe distance.
- **Pelican Women's Championship:** The Pelican Women's Championship is scheduled for November 16 - 22, 2020. ## Public Safety

### Key Trends and Actions

Social distancing measures following the 4/7/2020 meeting greatly improved. Please don't forget to Look, Light, Lock.

It is very important to tell citizens who contact you about a police matter to **call the police non-emergency number at (727) 588-3500** no matter how minor the issue. This will ensure an on-duty police officer can respond 24/7 to their issue expeditiously.

Key messages across these channels focus on (1) impacts to Town of Belleair meetings, services, programs, and events, (2) social distancing, (3) hand washing and general practices to stay well. Messages specifically related to CDC, Department of Health, and Pinellas County guidelines are being shared directly from the sources that are subject-matter experts in the content.

### Belleair's Community Outreach Program for COVID-19

The Parks and Recreation Department has developed a Community Outreach Program for our older adults who are isolated and/or practicing social distancing. Through the program, residents can place orders at local retailers and a Town employee will pick those orders up and deliver them to the resident at no additional charge. ### Remote Recreation

The Parks and Recreation Department launched Remote Recreation in order to keep our community engaged and active during this difficult time. Activities and challenges have been distributed via e-blasts and social media over the past few weeks, including word searches, "I Spy" games, frisbee golf challenges, and art projects. Also, departmental staff have been posting a "Joke of the Day" on Instagram over the past week in an effort to lift people's spirits. The Department will continue to connect with our community through Remote Recreation until it is able to re-open to the public.

## Personnel Impacts

### Departmental Breakdown of Personnel Response

On May 4th, Staff will begin to transition back into workspaces while allowing supervisors creatively problem solve issues that arise. Of course, all social distancing measures will be adhered to. Flexible scheduling will be allowed to accommodate child care and facility constraints. May 11th we will open Town hall on Tuesdays and Thursdays during regular business hours. Employees and all visitors will

be screened or asked to conduct business remotely. June 1st the Town Hall will fully reopen for regular business, though some flexibility in employee scheduling may remain.

Building modifications will be put in place such as, access control points, sneeze guards, sanitary door openers, hand washing and sanitizing stations to help minimize contamination. In addition, enhanced daily cleaning and disinfection procedures will be put in place. Staff is obtaining quotes for increased filtration and sterilization for the HVAC systems.

A breakdown of departmental responses is outlined below. Contact information for Town employees is available at [www.townofbelleair.com/staff](http://www.townofbelleair.com/staff).

- **Administration Department:** Town Manager and Construction Project Supervisor mostly working on-site. Management Analysts and Town Clerk on-site Tues and Thurs. Zoom meetings will continue for the Commission for the near term, due to CDC in-person constraints.
- **Building Department:** Working remotely, on-site Tues and Thurs. Accepting appointments.
- **Support Services Department:** Director on-site / Employees blended to ensure coverage for Tues/Thursday
  - Finance: Blend of working remotely and coming on-site in shifts
  - Human Resources: Working remotely
  - Building Maintenance: On-site caring for the facility
- **Police Department:** Police administrative staff are on-site Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Officers are working 12-hour shifts (6:00 am - 6:00 pm and 6:00 pm - 6:00 am) in order to minimize personal contact and allow for extra patrols.
- **Public Works, Parks & Recreation Department:** Director reporting on site Tue/Thurs at a minimum
  - Public Works (Parks/Streets): Working on-site using social distancing guidelines, preparing for hurricane season, increasing tree trimming and roadway work.
  - Recreation: Preparing facilities for Phase 1 child care and Phase 2 summer camps
- **Solid Waste Department:** For now, pickup routes are continuing as normal. Solid Waste employees are wearing additional PPE and taking extra precautions in their daily work. Recycling is resuming May 7th..
- **Water Department:** Working on-site using social distancing guidelines

We've had two employees placed on paid administrative leave due to coronavirus exposure precautions. As of this reporting period no employees have tested positive for COVID-19.

<p><b>B. Current Status:</b></p>		

As of **11:00 AM 05/01** there are over **34,728** confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the State of Florida (**899** of these are non-Florida residents). There are now **748** confirmed cases of COVID-19, **224** hospitalizations, and **38** confirmed deaths in Pinellas County. 

- Maintain Unified Command

  - Staff and operate Pinellas County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to Level 1 - Virtual Activation
  - Monitor compliance with “Safer at Home” Order
  - Manage public messaging and communications
  - Continue priority actions to support mitigation, response and recovery activities
- o See Incident Action Plan (IAP) for current priorities for 4/27/2020 – 5/03/2020 on the WebEOC Reports Board

### COUNTY ACTIVITIES

- The Pinellas County EOC is activated to a Level 1 – Virtual Activation.
- o The EOC Operations Desk [REDACTED] is scheduled to be staffed weekdays 8:00 AM – 6:00 PM, and Saturdays from 10:00 AM – 2:00PM. The EOC Operations Desk will be closed on Sundays.
- The Sheriff's Office Call Center, **727-582-TIPS (8477)**, is activated to receive reports of violations of the County's “COVID-19 – Safer at Home” Order Daily from 7:00 AM - 11:00 PM.
  - The Citizen Information Center (CIC) is activated. The CIC phone number is [REDACTED]. The CIC is scheduled to be open weekdays 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM, and Saturdays from 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM. The CIC is closed on Sunday.
  - Pinellas County Emergency Management (PCEM) will be distributing a Situation Report Monday through Friday. Agencies are to provide updates by 1:00 PM daily in the WebEOC Event Board so items can be included in the Situation Report. An IAP will be developed weekly and sent out on Mondays.
  - The Pinellas County CARES Financial Assistance Program launched **yesterday, April 30** aiding individuals and families facing overdue rent and utilities. Additional CARES funding for qualifying small businesses within the community launches on Monday, May 4. See <https://covid19.pinellascounty.org/business/pinellas-cares/pinellas-cares-financial-assistance> for more information.
  - Pinellas County is holding two webinars in partnership with 211 Tampa Bay providing an overview of the Pinellas CARES Financial Assistance Program for individuals and families. See WebEOC Activity Log (Record #14984) for more information.
  - **PCEM met today to discuss sheltering strategies for hurricane scenarios in a COVID-19 environment. Additional meetings with sheltering partners will be held as the planning continues.**

- Universal testing for COVID 19 will begin Monday, May 4 through the Community Health Center. Three testing locations have been identified (Pinellas Park, Clearwater, and St. Petersburg). Testing will be available for individuals with or without symptoms. Planning for a north county site is underway as are discussions to provide testing in transportation challenged areas. A site visit for a potential testing location is planned for Sunday, May 3. The next planning meeting will be held on Monday, May 4 at 10:00 am.
  - Public beaches and parking will reopen **Monday, May 4 at 7:00 AM**. Residents must follow CDC social distancing guidelines and remain at least six feet apart from anyone they do not live with, in groups of 10 or fewer people.
  - Community pools reopened at **6:00 AM Thursday, April 30** at 50% of posted capacity. Pool users must follow CDC social distancing guidelines and remain at least six feet apart from anyone they do not live with, group must be 10 or fewer people.
  - Private playground at child care center reopened at **6:00 AM Thursday, April 30**. Public playgrounds are still closed.
  - **The BCC met today and adopted Resolution 20-38 extending the local state of emergency, Resolution 20-39 clarifying local restrictions, and issued Order 20-6 terminating the restriction on alcohol sales. The State of Florida and Pinellas County Guidance for Phase 1 Reopening was also released. Documents are in WebEOC Activity Log (Record #14988)**
  - **The Pinellas Public Library Cooperative is updating community library available services and reopening dates here: [https://drive.google.com/file/d/1XGvU4D\\_ODxTz-7cd026kTCaP56LCins5/view](https://drive.google.com/file/d/1XGvU4D_ODxTz-7cd026kTCaP56LCins5/view)**
  - A Pinellas County Staging Area (CSA) continues to operate to receive supplies and prioritize disbursement:
- o To date has completed **1675** mission requests, partially filled **97** mission requests, **334** requests are pending.
- PCEM continues with planning for hurricane season including updating information in the hurricane guide on protective measures, looking at evacuation scenarios, assessing mobile home occupancy for residents that normally would return north this time of year, adding virtual hurricane preparedness presentations, shelter planning and working with local hotels to become part of the FEMA Temporary Shelter Assistance Program. PCEM will be looking to the Working Groups for their assistance in developing strategies.

### Working Group Updates

- Working Groups are to identify key objectives and provide to [REDACTED]. See IAP for current priorities for 4/27/2020 – 5/03/2020 on the WebEOC Reports Board.
- Updates will not be provided if a group did not meet on the day the Situation Report is posted, unless the group relayed information to include in the Situation Report. For past updates on working groups, please reference previous Situation Reports in WebEOC for situational awareness.
- **Behavioral Health:**
  - o Facilities reported no changes to behavioral health service delivery with the state's re-opening steps, though they are planning for possible increases in cases.
  - o Facilities should plan for PPE several weeks in advance, make arrangements accordingly and continue to submit resource requests to PCEM.
  - o The Foundation for Healthy St. Pete is hosting an interview on the radio (WTMP channels 1150am, 97.5fm, 102.1fm and online at [am1150wtmp.com](http://am1150wtmp.com)) **Saturday, May 2 from 10:30 to 11:00 AM** regarding community behavioral health needs and available resources.
  - o A Facebook Live event will be held next **Thursday, May 7 at 12:30 PM** in partnership with Operation PAR to inform parents on what stressors to look for in their children as they may be experiencing greater stress as schools remain using online-learning for the rest of the school year and what resources are available.
    - **Business:**
      - o The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) program is back, however, funding remains a challenge. There are discussions about the possibility of a third wave of funds.
      - o The Pinellas County small business grant program is getting close to completion and will be available Monday, May 4. Loans in the amount of \$5,000 will be available for local small businesses. \$35M has been set aside for this program.
      - o The Alternate PPE group met today:
        - Fire/EMS will not be moving forward with the 3D printed respirator adaptors. This would have been a third form of PPE for them, and they feel confident in their ability to acquire their primary and even secondary PPE from their current sources.
        - Eva Kubiak's surgical mask production line has signed the lease and is working on FDA approval. They are now waiting on sewing machines to be delivered, but the delivery is behind schedule.
        - There is a local demand for cloth masks, however, at this time there are no plans for the County to purchase them.

- Pinella Park fire station has acquired a mobile vapor hydrogen (VHP) sterilization machine. N95 masks can be sterilized up to 20 times through this process. The station is working on a tracking best practice system with customers.

- o Medical gowns are in high demand. Economic Development is working with EMS to identify the material standards for the type of cloth to use.
- o Visit St. Pete/Clearwater is sending messaging out on social distancing and cleaning procedures to their market as a local business starts to re-open.
- o The Airport (PIE) will be releasing an action plan that will define cleaning and social distancing procedure within the airport.
- o A local company is ready to begin producing surgical masks and will have the capability to manufacture 50,000 a day. They have signed a lease and have also sourced the needed fabric and are currently working with the FDA on certification.

- **Community Well-Being:**

- o The Faith-Based Organization (FBO) sub-group is hosting a webinar on **Tuesday, May 5 at 5:00 PM** for faith-based leaders in the community to discuss creative ways to re-open and maintain best social distancing practices. Faith-Based community leaders can register at [https://zoom.us/webinar/register/WN\\_jKTP4T4wTK-bfWxf8I0IWA](https://zoom.us/webinar/register/WN_jKTP4T4wTK-bfWxf8I0IWA). The FBO sub-group met **April 30** to finalize planning effort.
- o FBO continues to make and donate cloth masks for helpers, donation sites, and emergency personnel.
- o The group continues to plan for at-home Cinco de Mayo event, create public service announcements, and distribute post cards.
- o The group, in partnership with the Early Learning Coalition, is starting to talk through the process and logistics to re-open childcare facilities.

- **Data Management**

- o Updates to the Executive Policy group Dashboard will include policy event dates to show changes in data around those events.
- o The group is also working on developing charts from the draft re-opening plan and State Gating Criteria, and is also considering developing charts based on the Governor's re-open presentation.
- o Various department (including EM, ED, OMB, CVB, BDRS, and HS) met to discuss data focused around economic and community impact to help tell the full story of COVID-19's impact in Pinellas County. Various resources have been identified and future collaboration is expected.

- **EMS/Fire:**

- o 911 call volumes remain lower than normal but are expected to increase as the county reopens.

- **Fatality Management**

- o No updates at this time.

- **Feeding**

- o PCEM is working with Feeding Tampa Bay (FTB) to deliver food as needed. Any long-term care facilities in need of food resources, please send contact information to [REDACTED] and PCEM will connect the facility directly with FTB.

- **Finance:**

- o Webinars will be held **May 6, 3:00 PM** for municipalities, **May 7, 3:00 PM** for private non-profits, and **May 8, 3:00 PM** for healthcare agencies to navigate through available resources and provide general tips for FEMA Public

- o Hospitals need to be mindful and take careful stock of their PPE supplies as elective surgeries begin again.

- o There continues to be limited cases within homeless shelters with minimal use of non-congregate sheltering at hotel

- **Nur ing Home /ALF/Home Health**
