Thank you Mayor and Commissioners for your time-AS ALWAYS!

I will be on zoom tonight but wanted to make sure I got my comments to you.

I am very concerned about the nature of the discussion regarding Poinsettia Road. At the most basic level I find the terminology of "reopening" to not be helpful as the Town of Belleair did not close Poinsettia-as you are aware the Town of Largo closed Rosery.

I have comments/questions about access for EMS, blocking an artery that can be used for an evacuation route, and forcing traffic onto other roads that are already heavily traveled (and the closure of Mehlenbacher), the number of non-resident speeding tickets issued in that area, the percentage of crime in that are of our neighborhood vs. other areas, etc. I assume these may be discussed tonight.

In my opinion, closing the road sends a terrible community message that non-residents are not welcome and seen as some kind of threat. I may be wrong-and I am open to that-but why if you are on the corner of Rosery and Clearwater/Largo road (which is four lanes), would you use Poinsettia to come down to IRR (a two lane road with a roundabout) to "avoid traffic"? Just doesn't make any sense to me.

Finally, I believe closing Poinsettia road is not only inconvenient, but sets a precedence that a group of residents can request an action of the Commission that benefits only themselves, and not our entire town. This really could open Pandora's box....

You are an amazing team, giving much of your time and energy to our wonderful community, and our family truly appreciates all you do.

I spoke at an earlier Commission meeting opposing any action which would close or inhibit free passage of automobiles from Rosery Road to Poinsettia Road. In that I am unable to attend the meeting scheduled for 6pm today I wish to make my position know to the Commission. For the record I am drawing from my experience as the retired Pinellas Country Director of Public Safety Services and as a graduate engineer to base my comments.

- The City of Largo has constructed the Rosery road with no provision for a turn around at the junction with Poinsettia road. If the Commission decides to either close or impede traffic by use of a gate I would expect the City of Largo will pursue some form of remuneration from the Town of Belleair to construct such a turn around.
- 2. The Town of Belleair is serviced for fire and EMS by Largo Fire. Station 43 is our primary responder but if not available Station 41 responds. The Rosery/Poinsettia corridor is critical to enable timely responses. A study by Pinellas County's Safety Services Department must be done before any decision can be made.
- 3. Continuing the use of Bel Forest Road creates excessive traffic and is an unfair imposition on the residents of Belleair Forest.

I trust the Town of Belleair Commission will take these three points into serious consideration and will reject the proposal to close the street.

Dear Town of Belleair Commissioners,

Thank you for all that you do for our town, always.

I am planning to attend the meeting tonight virtually, but I was concerned that there may not be enough time to share feedback about the Poinsettia Road item on the agenda.

I have been so excited that once again our community can utilize Poinsettia Road and Rosery Road to get to the arterial roads of our community. I understand that there is an idea that this may not happen. I would like to share my feedback with the Commission as I feel that there are many reasons why I believe that Poinsettia Road should be made available and open.

- Poinsettia Road was only impacted because the City of Largo had to do necessary water, sewer, and road improvements to the Rosery Road portion of the road, so the question of "re-opening" is very concerning when it wasn't "closed" to begin with. It was simply unusable while under construction.
- 2. Mehlenbacher Road is an older, less safe road to travel on. It has numerous locations that do not offer complete visibility because of the side drainage and significantly overgrown foliage and is not large enough to safely handle traffic from the entire community. Additionally, it does not offer a direct route to Missouri Avenue. As a result, the only routes from Belleair to Missouri would be Ponce de Leon Blvd. and West Bay Drive. This is a long distance to travel and could potentially cause an increase to the overall traffic flow on these smaller roads.
- 3. The potential closure of one east/west crossing of Pinellas Trail may be a bad precedent to start when there are so many of these such crossings along the entire north/south run of the entire Pinellas County Trail.

- 4. Rosery Road is now a newly paved, adequately constructed road to today's standards and traffic counts. It does not seem logical not to use such a road and consequently push traffic to less functional roads, resulting in potentially dangerous situations for all drivers and pedestrians. As a mother of three daughters, I am passionate about making sure that all younger drivers are given safe road access. Also, it is confusing when a driver has to weave around small roads to get from one point to another.
- 5. To add additional long-term traffic to Ponce de Leon Blvd., in close proximity to child drop off areas by the Belleair Recreational Center, soccer fields, and a school facility seems potentially dangerous.
- 6. Closing Poinsettia Road would remove an arterial road that can be used for emergency and emergency medical purposes.
- 7. Many residents and community members have been impacted on a daily basis since work commenced on the roads. That seemed acceptable given that there was an end in sight. Traffic for over one year has been pushed to other less functional roads including Mehlenbacher Road, Ponce de Leon Blvd., Belleview Blvd., and further Jasper St. Now that the roadwork is completed, all roads that were previously impacted (Poinsettia Road and Rosery Road) should be able to be utilized for use by the community and all of the residents.
