### CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PLAN APPROVED

### BELLEVUE BILTMORE GOLF CLUB SOLD, UNDER CONSTRUCTION

After officially selling and closing in early June, the Bellevue Biltmore Golf Club will soon undergo a complete renovation and overhaul, as it will be closed for construction until May of 2019. This construction will revamp the greens and will include demolition of the current structures in wake of a new, state-of-the-art facility and grill-house restaurant.

### PHASE III WATER SHORTAGE AFFECTS ALL OF PINELLAS COUNTY

In May, the Southwest Florida Water Management District declared a modified phase III water shortage for all sixteen counties in the district. This declaration limits all lawn and landscape watering to once-per-week for a maximum of fourteen hours per week per property. Phase III also limits non-commercial car washing to one time per week (on the property's watering day). Please be aware of these changes, as the Water Department will be enforcing them throughout the shortage.
